

The Death of Michael Phelan.

The sudden demise of this noted veteran of the billiard world was announced in the **TIMES** yesterday. It was known that since his accident at the international yacht race, he had been more or less an invalid; but it was not supposed that any fatal disease had taken hold of him. On Saturday, however, he died suddenly, at his residence, greatly regretted by a host of warm friends. No man in the whole fraternity was held in more esteem than **MICHAEL PHELAN**, his kindly disposition ever inducing him to extend a liberal hand in aid of any charitable object. His last act of this kind being his contribution in aid of the benefit of the Union Home *fête champêtre* now in progress at the Fashion Course. As a manufacturer, he stood at the head of the most complete billiard establishment in the world, and as a player he once had no equal in the country. The funeral will take place on Wednesday from his residence, No. 438 West Twenty-third-street.
