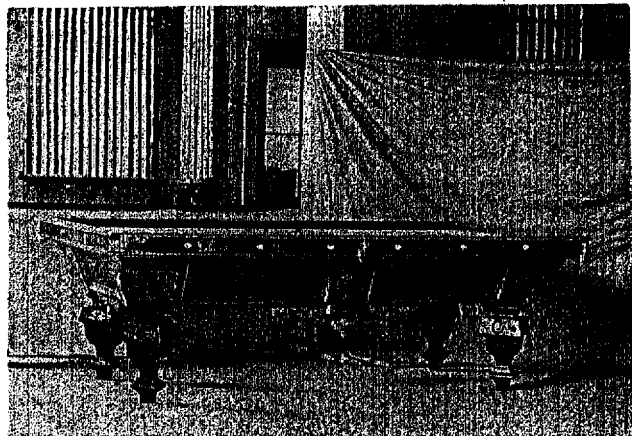

DESIGN FOR A BILLIARD-TABLE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **7,387**, dated April 21, 1874; application filed March 11, 1874.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, FREDERICK E. HELD, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a Design for Billiard-Tables, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is hereby made.

A represents the frame, which is beveled or inwardly sloped, supporting a rectangular bed, B. The square corners of the frame are cut away on a curve, representing a pointed arch,

a, on the face of each corner so cut away. C are the legs, which are square, the face *c* of each leg being parallel with the arched face *a* of the corner.

What I claim as new in bevel-framed billiard-tables is—

The design formed by the curved corners *a* and the square legs C, substantially as herein described and shown.
